

NCDVD Executive Board Fall Planning Meeting October 17-18, 2023 Immaculate Conception Seminary, Huntington, NY

Action Items Approved Motions

The meeting was convened at 10:04 am by Fr. Brian Buettner, who led an opening prayer.

- 1. Approve agenda: motion by Fr. Chuck, seconded by Fr. Jordan. All voted to approve agenda.
- 2. NCDVD Episcopal Board Meeting: November 13, 2023
 - a. 13 bishop members of Episcopal Board, many of whom have served for many years
 - b. Recent areas of focus have been development and collaboration with FOCUS for seminarian experience
 - c. Fr. Brian will NOT represent NCDVD Board at the meeting
- 3. USCCB CCLV Meeting: November 11-14, 2023
 - a. Rose represents NCDVD to CCLV as a facilitator for represented organizations and also serves as a consultant to the bishops
- 4. **<u>NCYC</u>**: Indianapolis, November 16-18, 2023
 - a. Clergy Central NCDVD assists in hospitality and engagement of bishops, priests, and seminarians
 - b. Adoration Chapel NCDVD coordinates chapel, provides DiocesanPriest.com prayer cards
 - c. Ongoing relationship between NCDVD and NCYC has been fruitful in cultivating sacramental and prayer opportunities at the conference
 - d. NCDVD will send out an email blast to vocation directors asking who is coming to NCYC

- iii. Adoration Chapel
 - 1. Relics must be approved by NCDVD
 - 2. Liturgy of the Hours NCDVD invites bishops to preside
- b. SEEK25 in Salt Lake City may need to determine plan for seminarians to serve Masses and be present in adoration chapel
- c. Founders Forum: 120 benefactors, The Cloister at Sea Island, Georgia; February 8-11, 2024; Rose will be giving a talk

- a. 5 Day: 12 retreatants (In 2023: 18)
- b. 8 Day: 9 retreatants (In 2023: 10)

7. General Programs

- a. **National Prayer Breakfast** Washington, DC, February 8, 2024; Rose is unable to attend, so NCDVD will not be represented
- b. 2024 NAPA Summer Conference, July 24-28, 2024
 - i. 2024 gathering follows immediately after the National Eucharistic Congress, so unsure who will be present at both and what best value of presence for NCDVD will be
 - ii. Will look to Bob Flanagan on best path forward for NCDVD presence and presentation at Napa Institute in 2024 or 2025
 - iii. Motion by Fr. Chuck, seconded by Fr. Brian for NCDVD to attend Napa Institute in 2024. Approved unanimously by board
 - iv. Motion by Fr. Chuck, seconded by Fr. Brian to have option to give presentation at Napa Institute in 2024 or 2025 pending advice of Bob Flanagan et al. Approved unanimously by board.
 - v. Fr. Neal, Fr. Chuck, and Fr. Jordan are available to attend Napa Institute 2024
- c. 2024 National Eucharistic Conference and Pilgrimage
 - i. Utilization of Seminarians at the Congress
 - 1. General labor: communion guides, sacristy assistance, adoration chapel; training portal will be created giving instructions on particular roles
 - 2. Free housing plan fell through
 - 3. Proposal to allow seminarians to attend for free; not yet finalized

- Once seminarian involvement plans are finalized, NCDVD will send out information to vocation directors asking how many seminarians will be attending
- 5. Vocations Pavilion in marketplace: overseen by USCCB and CCLV, staffed and coordinated by NCDVD. More information forthcoming.
- ii. National Eucharistic Pilgrimages
 - 1. 2 seminarians assigned to each of four perpetual pilgrimage team; housing, meals, stipend will be provided during pilgrimage and at the Congress; only cost to home diocese is transportation to starting point and from Congress
 - 2. Formation provided by Augustine Institute beginning in February 2024 for entire team; encourage seminarians to participate
 - 3. Requirements for Seminarians to Participate
 - a. Availability for entirety of May 17 July 21, 2024
 - b. Completed at least one year of Configuration Stage
 - c. Preference given to those finishing a pastoral year
 - d. Good physical condition to complete walking 10-15 miles per day
 - e. Agreement to refrain from all alcohol and tobacco throughout the pilgrimage
 - f. Competent public speakers
 - g. Prepare a 3-5 minute video as part of application speaking to why they want to participate in this pilgrimage and how the Eucharist has impacted their life
 - h. Approval of Vocation Director and Bishop
 - i. Invited by Vocation Director, who gathers application and submits materials to NCDVD Board
 - Fr. Chuck and Fr. Brian will represent board in reviewing applications and selecting seminarian pilgrims and will prepare document to give to Regional Coordinators
 - Information will be given to Regional Coordinators to pass on to their members; deadline for submitted applications to National Office: November 27, 2023

9. Financials

- a. Following past practice of raising dues by 30% every three years, this is the year in which dues will see that increase. The increase will be for 2024 dues. Invoices will be sent electronically to the primary vocation director in December 2023.
- b. Venue fees for Convention Comparison:
 - i. 2022 Hotel in Baltimore ~\$154,000
 - ii. 2023 Retreat Center in Huntington ~\$34,000
- c. Board reviewed financial documents. Benefits of having 2023 convention in Huntington has increased financial stability of the organization.

d. Development

- i. Motion proposed by Rose and seconded by Fr. Brian to ask Bob Flanigan to be named Chair of a new NCDVD Development Committee for a term of 3 years. Motion is approved unanimously by the board.
- ii. Rose asked the board to reflect on whether they have people in their dioceses who could assist in development efforts for NCDVD.
- iii. Goal is to raise \$150,000 each year.

10. 2023 60th Convention: Hilton, Minneapolis, MN, hosted by Region VIII, August 23-30, 2024, \$175 per night

- a. General update
 - i. Only 3 concurrent workshops due to space constraints
 - ii. For Institute: room for 100 people, chapel, and meal space; need to determine space for small groups
 - iii. Separate space for Pre-Con on Monday
 - iv. Meals:
 - 1. Lunch every day but Wednesday
 - 2. No daily breakfasts; AMS will do a sponsored breakfast
 - 3. No hospitality unless it is sponsored
 - 4. Two dinners: Monday and Thursday (opening and closing)
 - v. Need to emphasize staying in hotel because of contractual obligations to fill rooms

 - ii. Cultivating small group of more major benefactors 30-50 people
 - iii. Begin as operational support plan, not endowment or capital
 - iv. What groups or individuals are board members connected to which might be a source of potential benefactors?

- Board members asked to consider and submit names to Rose and Bob for potential members of volunteer team. Responsibilities:
 - i. Zoom call every 2-3 weeks
 - ii. Oversee Moves Management process with benefactors
- g. Bob Flanigan agreed to become the chairperson of the NCDVD/DiocesanPriest.com Development Committee.

- a. Registration portal opened early just for member dioceses, then six weeks later for exhibitors and supporters.
- b. Password sent to membership to use for advance registration.
- c. Need to do this advance membership registration is in preparation for return to Huntington in 2025 due to limited number of rooms at the seminary.
- 13. <u>Future Conventions</u> the board discussed needs for future sites for Convention. All agreed that the needs of the convention must guide the selection of sites, in particular the ability to have common spaces for flow between accommodations, exhibits, workshops, chapel; the ability to have extended periods of adoration throughout the day; the ease of potential overflow rooms; and reasonable, all-inclusive cost
